**SCHEME FOR SUB-INSPECTORS LIMITED DEPARTMENTAL
COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR CENTRAL POLICE
ORGANISATION:**

1. Name of the Examination:

Sub-Inspector's Limited Departmental Competitive Examination for GD Cadre in the CPOs.

2. Duration:

Sub-Inspectors Limited Departmental Competitive Examination will be held separately by all the CPOs every year.

3. Eligibility conditions:

Constables/GD, Head Constables/GD and ASI(Exe) will be eligible to appear in the said LDCE. Tradesmen, who meet QRs to appear in SI/LDCE are also eligible to appear in SI/LDCE.

- a) Service eligibility : They should have completed four years of service, including basic training.
- b) Upper age and Educational qualification : The upper age limit for appearing in the LDCE will be 32 years. The required education qualification will be graduation, which is also the eligibility for DR SIs.
- c) Clean record : They should have maintained good ACRs of last four years and should have unblemished service records till the issue of offer of appointment
- d) Physical standards : As applicable to SI/DE candidates
- e) Medical category : SHAPE-1

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4. Number of chances admissible:

In all, three chances will be given for appearing in the LDCE.

5. Agency, Syllabi & procedure:

The examination will be conducted by the individual Forces and will consist of written and physical tests.

The syllabi will be decided by the individual Forces. If considered necessary, BPR&D may be consulted.

6. Distribution of vacancies:

The distribution of vacancies at SI level for LDCE will be as per the recruitment rules.

7. Scheme of Examination

Examination will consist written and physical test as per the standard laid down by the Staff Selection Commission, as under:-

Stage-I : Checking of service records : No marks are allotted for stage-I. However it should be ensured that candidates maintain Good ACRs and unblemished service record.

Stage-II : (Physical measurement): As applicable to SI Direct entry candidates. No relaxation will be given in case a candidate has been appointed in lower rank with relaxed standard, such candidate will not be eligible to appear in the Limited Departmental Competitive Examination.

Stage-III : Physical Efficiency Test (PET) : It will be of qualifying nature consisting of the following five items:-

Men

- a) 100 meter race in 16 seconds.
- b) 1.6 Km in 6 minutes 30 seconds
- c) Long Jump, 12 feet in 3 chances
- d) High jump, 3.9 feet in 3 chances
- e) Shot put, 14.8 feet in 3 chances

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Women

- a) 100 meter race in 18 seconds.
- b) 800 meters race in 04 minutes.
- c) Long Jump, 9 feet in 3 chances
- d) High jump, 3 feet in 3 chances

PET shall not carry any marks. The tests will be qualifying/elimination tests.

Stage-IV : Written Examination: Written examination will comprise of the following papers:-

The paper-II of written examination will be evaluated in respect of those candidates who secure minimum of 45% qualifying marks in paper-I. Relaxation of 5% marks will be given to candidate belonging to SC/ST candidates.

It will be necessary for each candidate to secure at least 45% marks in each paper and 50% in aggregate of both papers. Relaxation of 5% marks will be given to candidates belonging to SC/ST members.

Stage-V : (Medical Examination): Detailed medical examination of those candidates who come out successful in the written & PET will be conducted, as per existing guidelines of the provision. Each candidate will be declared either fit or unfit, and no one will be categorized "temporarily unfit".


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8. Board of Officers: Board for conducting written and physical examination shall be headed by a DIG and assisted by Commandant and Dy Commandant. Concerned DIG will also detail a suitable doctor for carrying out medical examination in Stage-V. Board shall be as under: -

9 Training:

The selected SIs through the LDCE will undergo separate training of SIs and will be on probation for 2 years.

10. Relaxation:

The relaxation for SC/ST candidates will be admissible as per Government Rules.
