CM announces special recruitment drive for sportspersons in police

1,485 players from 35 teams compete in All India Police Wrestling Cluster

Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini on Wednesday announced a special recruitment drive for outstanding sportspersons of international and national repute in the state police force.

The announcement came during the valedictory ceremony of the 74th All India Police Wrestling Cluster (2025–26), held at Vachher Stadium, Haryana Police Academy, Madhuban.

"Energetic and promising players are the pride of our state. To encourage such emerging talent, I announce that soon such outstanding sportspersons will be recruited into Haryana Police," said the CM, responding to a demand raised by DGP Shatrujeet Kapur.

Thrilling finals, top medals

The five-day championship, held from September 20 to 24, saw participation from 1,485 players across 35 teams, including 1,135 men, 350 women, and 130 technical officials. Events covered arm wrestling, bodybuilding, boxing and wrestling.

CISF players secured 13 gold, 9 silver and 18 bronze medals for a total of 40. Uttar Pradesh bagged 12 gold, 15 silver and 19 bronze medals, while ITBP players claimed 9 gold, 4 silver and 6 bronze medals.

Hemlata of Uttar Pradesh 5-3 to bag gold, while in the men's freestyle 125 kg category, Haryana's Mausam Khatri overcame Ishaq Ahmed of J&K 2-1 to clinch top honours.
