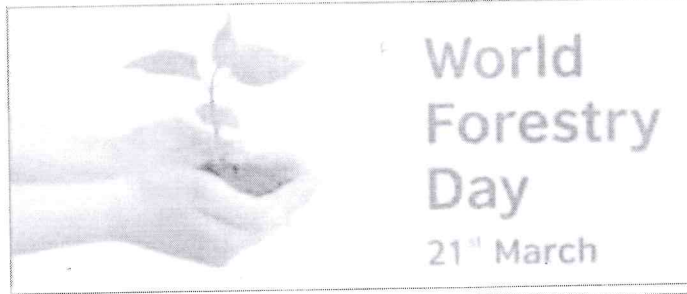

EARTH'S OXYGEN FACTORY – FORESTS

Forests are green, oceans are blue, keep the earth clean, for me and you. Don't be mean Go Green. Don't be sorry, do something more...

There are a number of such quotes and sayings that we have been hearing, especially more in number since 21st March, 2013 in particular. But why this date? This is when for the first time the World Forestry Day (WFD) or the International Day of Forests (IDF) was first celebrated all around the globe. The United Nations General Assembly officially proclaimed 21st March in 2012 as the WFD or IDF to celebrate and raise awareness of the importance of all kinds of forests around the world. Member nations of the UN have since then been encouraged to embark upon national & multinational activities and projects to promote the role of forests in our daily lives. This day has thus, become far more critical in the present day scenario. In form of climate change, especially when levels of oxygen have recorded a significant dip due increase in pollution, we all look

toward the producers and providers of the perennial source of oxygen with a lot of hope and support. Cutting down forests or deforestation, on the other hand, have been recorded to go on unabated in various parts of the world. This is counter-productive to all those efforts that have been made to protect levels of oxygen from slipping down any further due to climate change. WFD or IDF is a UN initiative to discourage the act of deforestation happening in the name of modernization. Drives like planting new trees, and a number of other awareness

programmes through all possible types of media — print, electronic, social, and digital are put into action in a big way throughout the world on March 21st every year.

Interestingly, the idea of putting aside a day for forestry has been under discussion at various meetings of the United Nations since 1971. Finally, it was passed in a resolution in November 2012 at the General Assembly of the UN. It was due to the efforts of the United Nations Forum on Forests and the Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO) that jointly pressed

upon the non-disputable importance of forests and the need to create awareness globally so that the growing menace of deforestation could be attended to. Besides the WFD, 2011 was celebrated as the international Year of Forests. During this year, a number of campaigns pressing on the need to grow more trees and spread awareness to fight against climate change due to deforestation were started. More and more trees were planted to demonstrate the all-time significance of the year of forests. Besides volunteers, shirts and other garments with slogans on them were worn by people. School and the general public were encouraged to visit where trees are in greater number provided serene surroundings to demonstrate the efficacy of forests as non-stoppable sources of oxygen. Workshops, conferences, and seminars in schools, offices and other workplaces were organized to create awareness about the importance of forests. Pasting banners and pamphlets on trees that may prevent

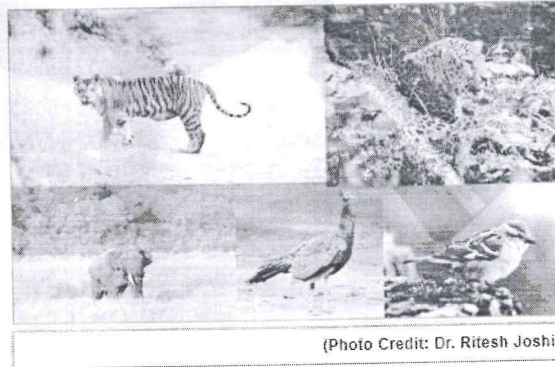

CAREER IN BIODIVERSITY CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCE MANAGEMENT

Environmental Science is a rapidly emerging area which requires a new vision of empowering youth about their nature and their role in conservation initiatives. It is now widely acknowledged that the sustainable development is the need of hour and thus responding to the growing environment crises (pollution, global warming, ozone layer depletion, acid rain, deforestation and desertification) in today's scenario. Sustainable development is development that meets the needs of the present, without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs (Brundtland Commission, World Commission on Environment and Development). Applying knowledge gained through environmental science is the only way to solve these problems so that the

studied constantly in order to avoid altering and damaging the environment

Environmental science is a multi-disciplinary field that integrates science related to ecology, biodiversity, biology, zoology, oceanology, limnology, soil science, geology and geography for the solution of environmental problems. It is a

phenomenon related to environmental issues at global level. This subject involving the protection and conservation of our environment spans to a great extent.

Students study concepts related to conservation of energy, climate change, pollution alongwith technologies/strategies for the management eg. to treat

corporate needs an environment officer to handle the environmental concerns of their production units, such as operating and maintaining waste water treatment plants, air quality monitoring, developing green belts, conducting energy & water audit. He/she can do Environmental Impact Assessment which is a process of evaluating the likely environmental impacts of a proposed project or development, taking into account inter-related socio-economic, cultural and human-health impacts.

A candidate with background in Environmental Sciences/ biodiversity conservation/natural resource management can understand the impacts of development on environment; can create awareness about environmental problems at local,
