

CISF rescues girl stuck on a narrow ledge at Metro stn

New Delhi: A 10-year-old girl who was stuck on a narrow ledge at the height of around 20 feet at Nirman Vihar Metro Station was rescued by a Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) constable on Sunday. The CISF constable who was on duty went to the girl and safely brought her back. A video of the incident has been widely shared on social media.

According to officials, while playing at the Metro station, the girl climbed on the wall adjacent to the stair of gate number one by using an iron grille and got stuck there. She started screaming after she reached the dangerous spot.

"As the location was quite high, about 20 feet from the ground level, the girl got scared. CISF CCTV observers noticed and informed the matter to the CISF Quick Reaction Team personnel present at the location. On getting information, constable NK Nayak acted smartly and rescued the girl

child safely," said a CISF official. The official added that due to alertness and prompt action by the CISF personnel, a precious life was saved.

After the girl was safely rescued, she was handed over to her mother. She thanked CISF for saving her daughter's life. The girl lives in the neighbourhood and got stuck near the grille while playing in an unpaid area of the Metro station. The incident took place around 6 pm.

The video of the rescue shows CISF personnel reaching out to the girl on the ledge. He then carefully lifts the girl off the ledge and carries her back to a safe location.
