## 'Sharp dip in terror due to PM's zero tolerance policy'

Hyderabad: Prime Minister Narendra Modi's zero tole-rance towards terrorism naxalism and anti-national activity has led to a signifi-cant dip in such incidents across the country, said Union home minister Amit Shah at the 54th Raising Day of Central Industrial Securi ty Force (CISF) at National Industrial Security Academy, Hyderabad, on Sunday. The event was held outside the national capital region for the first time in CISF's history.

"Majority of those involved in terrorism, naxalism are joining the mainstream. The country can't progress

# Kalari spectacle and mock Maoist strike wow audience at 54th Raising Day of CISF

#### Force's First Parade In Hyd. Outside Delhi

Hyderabad: A 172-women contingent of Central Indust rial Security Force (CISF) made an entry into the Natio-nal Industrial Security Academy ground with a bang and left the gathering floored im-mediately, as they displayed their Kalaripayattu skills an ancient form of martial art from Kerala. Clad in the traditional Kalari attire, the team showcased their talent in armed fighting at the 54th Raising Day of CISF at Ha-kimpet on Sunday, which left even Union home minister A-mit Shah in awe.

The women used sticks, swords, shields and their hands to demonstrate various acrobatic moves, even as different Bollywood tunes played in the background. The women trained in the art form after CISF decided to include Kalaripayattu in its tra-ining manual. Their performance on Sunday was met with thundering applause.

Following the breathta-king show, CISF personnel demonstrated how a hostile situation could be dealt with as they created a mock Mao-ist attack-cum-hostage situa-

hah reiterated the Centre's support to meet future challenges with better use of technology, including artificial intelligence. The home minister, who arrived in Hyderabad on Saturday evening, was given the customary guard of honour by CISF personnel. He left for Delhi on Sunday noon.

Lauding CISF's stellar role during the Covid-19 crisis, Shah said, the prime minister had acknowledged their services and paid tributes to those who died while aiding in the war against the pandemic. "The Centre initiated seve

ral welfare schemes for Cen-tral Armed Police Forces (CAPF). More than 35 lakh Ay-ushman CAPF cards have been distributed and the housing satisfaction ratio will be 73% by 2024, the highest since independence," he said.

He said, in the next 10 years many job opportunities would be created in CISF and recruitment avenues will be multi-fold. "In 1969, CISF comprised 3,000 personnel. Now, the strength has risen to 1.7 lakh. CISF is providing security to 66 sensitive and major air-ports, 14 major seaports, nucle-ar and space institutions, Delhi Metro, Statue of Unity and many industrial units and mines," said Shah. He said among CAPFs, CISF is the only force, which has an effective fr-refighting force. While dealing with 50 lakh commuters on Delhi Metro and airport every day, CISF remains committed to security of the nation's assets, he added.
